Yeola, Distt. Nashik-423401, Maharashtra with 50 seats in BAMS course from the academic session 2014-15 under Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970- reg.

Sir/Madam,

In continuation to the Department's letter of even No. dated 19.05.2014 wherein a Letter of Intent was issued to the college with respect to the proposal submitted to the Central Government as cited above, I am directed to say that after careful consideration of recommendations of the CCIM in terms of criteria as specified in the Regulations 5 and 10 of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approval of the Hon'ble HFM for the UG/PG course(s) for grant of permission for the academic session 2014-15 vide Department's letter No.R.11011/10/2013-EP (IM-1) dated 17.06.2014 (available on Department's website <indianmedicine.nic.in>); permission of the Central Government is hereby granted to the Jagdamba Education Society, Yeola, Nashik, Maharashtra to establish a new Ayurveda Medical College as Matoshri Asarabai Darade Ayurved College at Babhulgaon, Tal. Yeola, Distt. Nashik-423401, Maharashtra with intake capacity of 50 seats in BAMS course from the session 2014-15 under the provisions of the section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970. Therefore, the college may take admissions for the academic session 2014-15 subject to the condition that the following requirement should be fulfilled by the college positively by the 31st December, 2014:

- (i) Relevant provisions of the Minimum Standards Requirements of infrastructure and

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teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 and Regulation 10 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospital) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013 by 31st Decèmber 2014, to get conditional permission for the session 2015-16.

(ii) Relevant requirements under the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) (Amendment) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013 (for UG Ayurveda).

2. The college administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the relevant CCIM Regulations, are in position before the admission of the first batch of students in the 1st professional of BAMS course is made, under intimation to the Central Government and CCIM.

3. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for IInd, IIIrd and IVth professionals well in time as per the CCIM norms which will be verified and reported by the CCIM at least three months before the start of next professional and accordingly, the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be issued.

4. When the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course, the college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 14(2) of the IMCC Act, 1970.

5. As you are aware that, as per relevant Regulations, Performance Bank Guarantee of only Rs. 01.00 crore is required for permission to establish a new college with up to 60 UG seats which was also indicated in the Letter of Intent dated 19.05.2014. Hence, the additional Performance Bank Guarantee of Rs. 1.50 crores, bearing No. BOM0277BGNo.1/14-15/60171243429 dated 10.06.2014 is returned herewith in original to you.
